Our biggest week of the summer was once again a highlight!



## **SHOW UP**

One of our highlight events this year was Show Up, a summer-long experience designed to keep students connected, engaged, and growing in their faith. At the start of summer, students were divided into Red and Blue Teams and competed head-to-head each week in a variety of fun challenges. ## 1. Explorer Course - Our relationship with Jesus.

This course gives you time to think about the big questions in life, and to explore the life of the person at the heart of the Christian faith - Jesus Christ.

- Who is Jesus?
- · What did He achieve?
- What does it mean for us today?

## 2. Partner Course - Our relationship with the church.

This course introduces 8 commitments that bond the church together as the body of Christ. These are rhythms that form the foundation of Christian living in the midst of a chaotic world. Formed in the example of the early church in Acts, these rhythms guide us into a way of life shaped by Scripture. When we commit to living them out together in biblical community, as the body of Christ, we experience real growth and transformation, both personally and collectively.

## 3. Builder Course - Our personal calling beyond the church.

This course calls us into a lifestyle of being disciples who make disciples. A true disciple follows Jesus with the full intention of becoming like Him—choosing His way over our own, denying ourselves, and walking in obedient faith. This kind of discipleship is lived out through Missional Communities: groups of people living as the church on mission together, not just within the walls of the church building.

## **Missional Communities developing:**

We currently have four groups - Men of Purpose, two cultural groups (Brazilian and Indian), and Faith Driven Entrepreneurs. There are a total of 101 people who participated in these four communities in 2025.

Giving per week has increased from **\$27,840 in 2024** to **\$31,402 in 2025**, showing strong growth in generosity even as we take on new ministry and facility needs.

# WHAT THIS MEANS

While our giving has grown significantly, our expenses have also risen due to key investments that move ministry forward — including facility repairs, staffing transitions, and next-phase projects.

We're currently operating with a modest shortfall of about **\$1,829 per week**, which we believe can be closed through continued faithfulness and year-end generosity.

# **BUILDING TOGETHER**

## **Highlighting 2025**

The Building Together campaign continues to unite us around one mission: to prepare for the future while investing in the ministry God has entrusted to us today.

In 2025, your giving through Building Together allowed us to:

- ✓ Advance key facility projects, including critical maintenance and updates that keep our building ready for ministry.
- ✓ Fund initial design work for future renovations like restrooms and multipurpose spaces.
- Support our community impact ministries, including The Landing, Impact School of the Arts, and outreach events.
- ✓ Reduce debt and position Impact for the next phase of growth.

Through September 2025, the Building Together Fund has received \$67,894 toward this ongoing vision.

While we faced higher facility costs this year, these investments ensure that we're ready for what God is calling us to build next.

We're not just building a facility—we're building a foundation for ministry, mission, and the next generation.



# GO & BE

Impact has sent **\$97,301.71** (through September) to missions around the world in 2025!

Impact financially partners with 9 missions both locally and globally-Choices Pregnancy Services, Christian Mission in Asia, Hippo Valley Christian Mission (Zimbabwe), International Disaster Emergency Services, Kontaktmission (Europe), Lifeline Christian Mission (Haiti, Honduras, El Salvador, Cuba), Light of Life Rescue Mission (Pittsburgh), Mustard Seed Project (Japan), Rapha House (Trafficking & sexual exploitation rescue), Training Tomorrow's Leaders (Ghana), Worldwide Hispanic Outreach (Mexico).

We had five of our supported missions visit Impact: Kontaktmission in March, Passion in April, Training Tomorrow's Leaders in October, and Rapha House in November.

In 2025, we sponsored two mission trips. One in April to Eastern Tennessee to assist with community redevelopment after natural disasters. The second in July to Mexico with World Wide Hispanic outreach.



In May, many Impact members participated in the Choices Pregnancy Walk for Life at Moon High School and The Landing Grounds Cafe supplied coffee for their event.

In November, we will be packing shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child. We will also be holding a Chili Cookoff and Packing Party. This year we will also be a local drop off location for Operation Christmas Child.

We have provided special offerings to the needs below:

- \$450 to International Disaster Emergency
   Services to assist with the California Wildfires.
- \$500 for the Eastern Tennessee Mission Trip
- \$850 for the Mexico Mission Trip
- \$400 to Elkhorn Service Camp
- \$400 to Luke Woodard and his campus ministry efforts.
- \$400 to the West Hills Food Pantry
- \$3,680 for meals and shipment from the food packing event with IDES. Food was sent to Haiti.

We have contributed \$7,415.92 to our Good Samaritan fund to help families in need.

In September, we held our Mass Mobilization project. This was a food packing event with International Disaster Emergency Services. With almost 200 participants, we packed 45,540 meals that were sent to families in Haiti.

### THE LANDING HIGHLIGHTS & WINS

Record Participation

With more than 7,800 Landingtown visits this year, The Landing continues to connect with families from across Pittsburgh. Nearly 1,900 of those guests came for the very first time.

## Growing in the Arts

Impact School of the Arts has seen growth in total student registrations, adding new instructors, camps, and a successful spring show.

## Stronger Community Presence

We hosted 134 rentals this year (including large community events, sports teams, and birthday parties) while increasing overall revenue through larger events and repeat bookings.

## Café Momentum

Our Café saw a 76% increase in sales, introducing new menu items and creative promotions that help families linger longer and connect.

## Landingtown Improvements

We added new scooters, a dedicated parking area, and improved play equipment thanks to donations from generous Impact families.

#### Creative Events

Our first BFF Bracelet Bash brought 25 families together for a fun and meaningful community night of crafts and connection.

## WHAT THIS MEANS

The Landing is doing more than growing numbers—it's creating relationships. Every cup of coffee, every art lesson, every free play visit is an open door for someone to experience the love of Christ in a welcoming environment. In 2023, The Landing operated at a loss; by 2025 it has become a self-sustaining, mission-driven ministry that funds itself and serves the community.

Through your generosity, The Landing is not just a building it's a living picture of our mission to "Pursue God, Build Community, and Share Hope."

Part of our vision involves Missional Businesses. These businesses exist to advance the Kingdom mission by both supporting the work financially and creating meaningful opportunities to engage our community. Through them, we can expand the reach of the Gospel in practical and impactful ways.

# End of year (2025) summary:

Little Flyer's Clubhouse is an all inclusive play space that provides a safe play environment specifically for children with special needs and their families. This unique play space offers additional supports/ services to families by request. These may range from developmental services and play based therapy/coaching, to noise canceling headphones, compression vests.

# **BIG WINS**

- ✓ Celebrated one year of being open on 8/12/2025.
- ✓ Started play based coaching and successfully discharged two clients after 4-6 sessions.
- ✓ Local school district brought an autism support classroom in for a field trip during PSSA testing.
- ✓ Partnered with Impact Kids to open the sensory room available during 11:00 AM service.
- ✓ Added a 5th family to our Family Advocacy team. These team members are readily available to encourage & support families who have recently received a diagnosis.
- ✓ Families are continuing to utilize additional supports (timers, visuals, compression vests, sensory corner) provided to help their child with transitions and play.
- ✓ Therapists and service providers continue to recommend their caseloads to Little Flyer's Clubhouse.
- ✓ Families are continuing to recommend the play space to friends and leaving positive reviews on Google.





# **Impact School of the Arts**

Impact School of the Arts has 37 students this year, 2 of whom are registered for 2 classes. In 2024, we also had 37 students.

62% of our students are NEW and of those, almost half were from our Summer Camp!!!

27% of total enrollment came directly from Summer Camp! In fact, our largest class, Musical Theatre 2, were mostly students who came to camp!

Some of our 2025 events included the Valentine's Day Dance (108 participants) and Summer Camp (33 participants), this was DOUBLE the number from 2024!

We hired two new instructors, Miss Ryann Coleman and Ms. Sarah Puhala.
